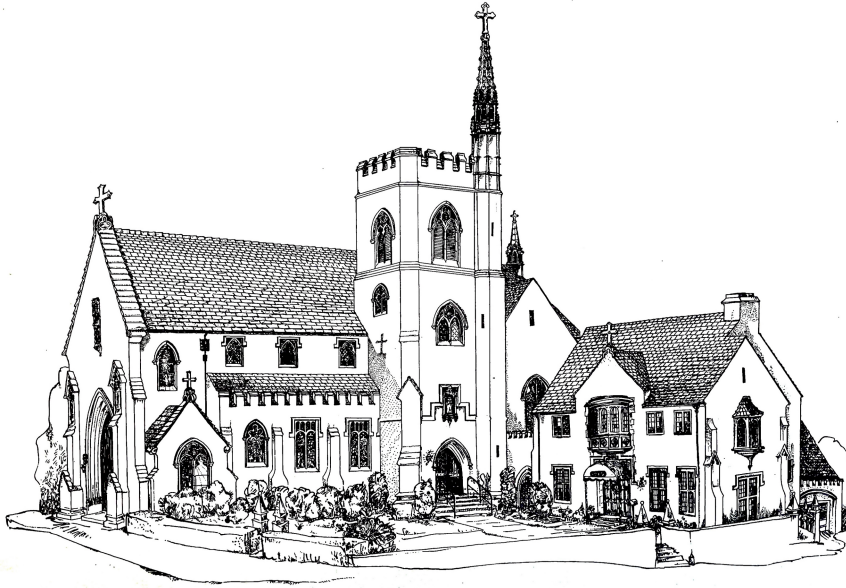

All-night Adoration is planned for the months of October, December, February 2027, March 2027 (40-Hour Adoration), and May. We encourage various ministries and groups to organize among themselves in choosing time-slots in which their members are committed to attend.

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Devotion to the Holy Face of Jesus is held on

the 3rd Tuesday of the Month after the 6pm Mass.

The Devotion to the Holy Face of Jesus focuses on honoring the sacred countenance of Our Lord as a means of reparation for blasphemy and the profanation of holy days. Historically rooted in the veil of Saint Veronica, the devotion gained widespread recognition in the 19th century through the mystical revelations of Sister Mary of St. Peter, a Carmelite nun in Tours, France. Pope Leo XIII formally established the devotion as an Archconfraternity in 1885. Later, Blessed Maria Pierina De Micheli further promoted the devotion by printing the Holy Face medal, which was approved by Pope Pius XII.

Today, faithful individuals dedicate Tuesdays—especially Shrove Tuesday—to prayer and contemplation before the image of Christ's face, seeking mercy and spiritual healing. By gazing upon His wounded countenance, believers are continually reminded of Christ's immense suffering and His enduring love for humanity.

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Blessing of Sacramentals: every first Sunday of the Month after the 12:30pm Mass. Prior to the Mass, you may place items to be blessed on the front benches by the rail. Note the signs indicating which type of sacramental to be place on the spots of the benches.

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Music Ministry Appeal Update: Through July, we have raised a total of **\$16,250** from second collections and the St. Joseph's Dinner in March. Thank you for your generosity.

At that time, when Jesus went into the house of one of the chief of the Pharisees on the Sabbath day to eat bread, they watched Him. And behold, there was a certain man before Him that had dropsy: and Jesus answering, spoke to the lawyers and Pharisees, saying: Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath day? But they held their peace: but He taking him, healed him, and sent him away. And answering them, He said: Which of you shall have an ass or an ox fall into a pit, and will not immediately draw him out on the Sabbath day? And they could not answer Him these things. And He spoke a parable also to them that were invited, marking how they chose the first seats at the table, saying to them: When thou art invited to a wedding, sit not down in the first place, lest perhaps one more honorable than thou be invited by him; and he that invited thee and him, come and say to thee: Give this man place; and then, thou begin with shame to take the lowest place. But when thou art invited, go, sit down in the lowest place: that when he who invited thee cometh, he may say to thee: Friend, go up higher: then shalt thou have glory before them that sit at table with thee: be-cause every one that exalteth himself shall be humbled, and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted.

It is truly meet and just, right and for our salvation, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks to Thee, holy Lord, Father almighty, eternal God: Who, together with Thine only-begotten Son and the Holy Ghost, art one God, one Lord: not in the Oneness of a single Person, but in the Trinity of one substance.
